



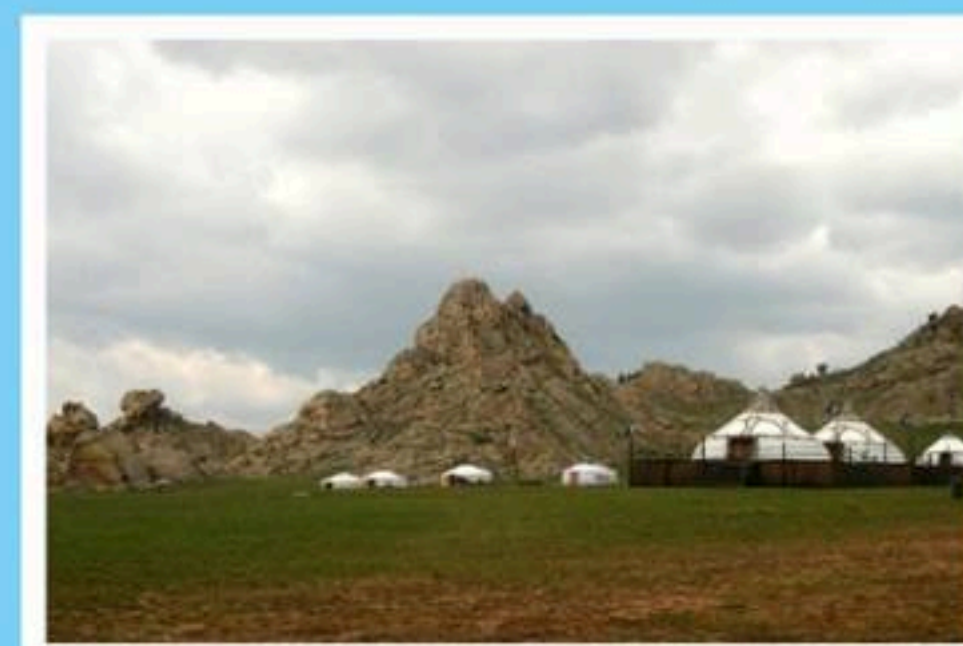

Course Objectives

Introduction to Mongolian Culture

This course is intended to give students the opportunity to visit many of Ulaanbaatar's most important cultural sights, as well take a trip to the countryside to experience true Mongolian hospitality, culture, and atmosphere. In addition to sightseeing, students will be introduced to the Mongolian language and will be able to read the alphabet, exchange pleasantries, and gain a foundation that will allow for further studying. Students will be expected to give daily presentations on what they learned from each cultural visit. To assist them, they will be given lectures and information from the head professor, who will accompany students every day along with a supporting staff member. The supporting staff member can answer additional questions about the language, culture, and history.
