A visiting student must have their academic records/transcript sent by their home institution directly to international@kutztown.edu. Submit evidence of English proficiency. To prove English proficiency, the home institution may provide an email or letter verifying the student has English language proficiency equivalent to a CEFR B2 level. Alternatively, the home institution may provide the student's English proficiency exam score: IELTS (6.0), TOEFL (70 or 3.5), or Duolingo (105).

ADMITTED EXCHANGE STUDENT – NEXT STEPS

View your Decision Letter: This letter can be viewed on your [Applicant Status Portal](#). Then complete one of the steps below:

- (Undergraduate) **Pay the \$300 USD Registration Deposit** in your [Applicant Status Portal](#) to confirm your enrollment and start the immigration steps. This is not an extra fee - the money will go towards your first semester bill.

- (Graduate) **Confirm your enrollment** in your [Applicant Status Portal](#) to start the immigration steps.

Complete the immigration steps to receive a Form DS-2019 (Needed for a J-1 visa):

- Complete the Sources of Funds Form** on your [Applicant Status Portal](#).

- Provide Evidence of Financial Support.** *Approximately \$7,740/semester*

- Provide Financial Support Form.** Sign the form indicating you are self-funded. Is a family member helping financially sponsoring you? If yes, they also need to sign the form. Access the form on your [Applicant Status Portal](#). You can upload or email the completed form.

On-Campus Housing will be assigned. This information will take student preference into account; however *specific residence halls are not guaranteed*. Students will be provided a default meal plan (if required) and can edit this plan once they can access their MyKU account.

The Academic Advisor for Exchange Students will create a class schedule. Selected courses will be based on preferences provided on the application. Students can change courses up through the first week of classes.

Note: Each Kutztown professor may grade individual assignments differently than the institutional chart. For example, faculty may grade on a curve grading scale. Grading on a curve refers to the modification of students' grades based on the performance of the class as a whole.

Transcript Information

Exchange and visiting students may view their unofficial transcripts on their MyKU student account at any time throughout their studies at Kutztown University. Final grades are not posted until about 10 days following the end of the semester.

Exchange and visiting students may request official transcripts in the following ways:

1. Current and recent students may request Official Transcripts in MyKU. This service will redirect students to complete the request through a company called Parchment. Students can request an official electronic transcript or an official paper transcript.
2. Prior students may request an Official Transcript directly through Parchment using their KU ID number. Students can request an official electronic transcript or an official paper transcript.

Campus Programs

International Arrival and Orientation Program

Arrival services include optional airport pickup and shopping trips. This office also provides a comprehensive orientation program with virtual and in-person components covering essential information on immigration, academics, campus life, and community resources.

Mentor Program

This program pairs new international students with current students who serve as mentors, helping them navigate campus resources, culture, and academics.

International Student Organization

ISO is a campus club that gives international students a community of support and provides events and opportunities for international and domestic students to connect and make friends.

Student ID Card

A student ID card will be issued for all new students. This card serves as a student ID, library card, meal plan card, and grants access to a variety of on-campus services, such as the campus shuttle. It is also used to access on-campus housing.

Campus Resources

Kutztown University offers a variety of resources for supporting international students.

The **International Office** supports incoming and current international students in maintaining their immigration status and accessing the benefits of their student visa.

The **Multicultural Center** offers fun activities and services to create awareness of cultural and racial identity as well as promoting and assisting with academic growth and leadership skills.

The **Student Success Center** provides tutoring and academic support for content knowledge of various academic disciplines in addition to workshops on time management, organization, and study skills.

The **Writing Center** provides academic support specifically in writing skills for homework, essays, or class papers.

The **Career Development Center** assists students in locating internships and reviewing resumes. Students may also seek on-campus employment in various campus offices and academic departments.

The university's **Rohrbach Library** has many welcoming study spaces as well as a café. There are computer labs with printers and scanners, a STEAMworks makerspace, as well as access to books, periodicals, and databases to complete projects and assignments.

The **Health and Wellness Center** provides quality health care, health education and promotion, and counseling and preventative services to the campus community in a caring, cost-effective and convenient setting on campus.



Transportation

All campus buildings are accessible by walking across campus. It takes about 15 minutes to walk across campus.

The **Campus Shuttle Service** is free with a KU Student ID during the fall and spring semesters.

- The On-Campus Loop brings students around the Residence Halls and main academic buildings.
- The Off-Campus Loop provides access to nearby apartments, and Kutztown's Main Street.
- The Late Night Loop from Thursday-Saturday, provides access to local supermarkets and a nearby shopping complex.

Rideshare is a common alternate method of transportation to get around locally and to other nearby cities.

From nearby Allentown, Pennsylvania, students can take **intercity or greyhound buses** to major cities including New York City, Newark, Philadelphia, Washington D.C., and Baltimore.

Students may sign up for **free airport pickup** services from the following airports: Newark, Philadelphia, and Allentown.

Safety

The **KU Public Safety and Police Services** office supports the safety and security of the campus community and work with local law enforcement to respond to emergencies.

The **KU Alert System** includes text, e-mail, and website alerts that focuses on campus safety and keeping students updated. They will get important safety notifications from University Police, including when the campus is closed due to unsafe weather conditions or recent safety alerts.
